What's My Line

How many of you veteran fisherman have stopped by Cabela's, Bass Pro, or Gander Mountain to buy a spool of fishing line only to be blown out of the water by an entire 50 foot wall of line choices? Last month Norm Hartmann, Regional Sales Manager of Cortland Fishing Lines, took time to explain the differences in available lines.

It was good to hear the advantages and characteristics of available products coming from a respected, US based (upstate New York) and owned company like Cortland Lines. This company offers some unique lines that are favored by many experienced anglers:

- Endurance – Cost effective monofilament used very effectively for Fly Fishing tippets.
- Camouflage – Very low visibility monofilament used in clear water situations (favored by some professional anglers over fluorocarbon line).
- Premium Ice Fishing Line – PVC coated Monofilament used for tip-up lines that never absorbs water and never wears out like braid.
- Flea Flicker Line – 20 lb. or 30 lb. Monofilament used in Great Lakes trolling that will not let water fleas grab on.
- Toothy Critter Leader Wire – Teflon coated stainless steel leader material, great for pike and muskies. You don't need crimpers and the tough material is very flexible and can be tied with any knot.
- Master Braid – Very popular muskie line usually in the 65 lb. to 80 lb. tests. It casts farther, with greater accuracy than other super braids on the market. Most popular color is blue (as in blend-

ing in with the SKY).

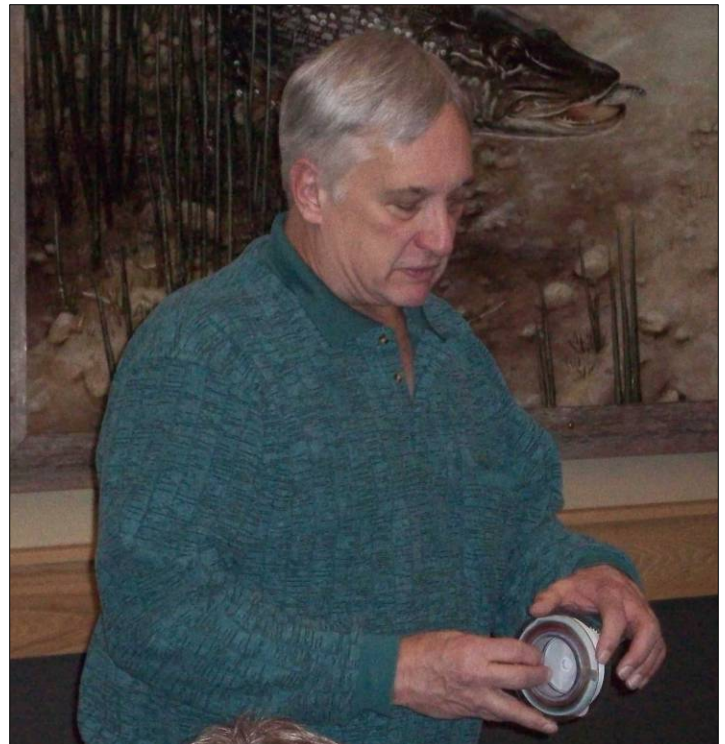
