Mastering the use of Floats & Bobbers

Remember the first time your Dad took you fishing? He probably maneuvered a glob of slimy worms on your hook and threw out your line with a red and white bobber the size of a baseball. You were then instructed to wait until the bobber went under at which point you were to yank the lips right off that fish.

Well the science of using those floats have come a long way since then as the Arlington Anglers were reminded by speaker and guide Pat Harrison (patharrisonoutdoors.com) at the September Meeting:

- a. All floats/bobbers must be matched with the weight of the hook, bait, and lead on the line so as to float about 50% submerged.
- b. Most floats have two or three colors arranged concentrically from top to bottom. This is done to easily identify fish not only pulling down but those species that swim upward with the bait.
- c. Fixed bobbers are easy to attach to a line, but are often limited to shallow water appli-

cations because the bobbers cannot be reeled thru the line guides.

d. Slip bobbers have a wider use because they can be used in any depth of water and fish suspension level. Knots of thread are tied on the line at the appropriate distance from the hook. This method takes a

little more preparation, as the line has to be fed thru the knot, bead, and float ahead of time. The knot can be wound into the reel (the float "slips" down to the hook or stopper weight or swivel) and depths can easily be adjusted.

e. There are many other applications for floats. Lighted floats can make night fishing easy. Special floats can be attached to fly lines so that flies
