Being At The Right Place, At the Right Time

How many times have you heard this at the launch ramp? "You should have been last week.". How many times have you had a pretty good day fishing at a lake and then , a month later, you bring back your buddies, only to get skunked?

If you are an experienced fisherman, you know that there are certain times of the year that are prime for a particular body of water. My father always wanted to hit the Wolf River when the lilacs were blooming. That approach always seem to work, whether it was an early or late spring.

Arlington Anglers was fortunate to have Sun-Times Outdoor Writer, Dale Bowman describe his fishing prime time calendar last month. Dale strongly believes that every month of the year presents a unique and prime fishing opportunity in the Chicago Land area that should not be missed. See if you agree:

- January – Early ice fishing can be quite good. With the heavy ice, all of Busse Woods Reservoir is accessible. Some of the inland trout are left over and very catchable thru the ice at Axe Head, Silver, and other Forest Preserve lakes.
- February – Pre-spawn walleyes can be good at Pecatonica River, Illinois River, and other places with moving water.
- March – Cooling lakes open for shore and boat fishing. Cohos start in Indiana and brown trout stack up at the Chicago break walls.
- April – Boat fishing for perch can start up in Waukegan and Chicago followed by those tasty spring cohos.
- May – The spawning small mouth bass can be hot in Indiana and the Chicago Lakefront (boat or shore). Try around the Shedd Aquarium.

- June – This is the prime month for Lake Front perch!
 - July – Peak steel head fishing in the Indiana streams, rivers, and where they flow into Lake Michigan.
 - August – Many think these are the dog days, but lower water levels in the rivers concentrate the small mouth. Out on the big lake, boaters can take those big steel head and kings.
 - September – Big salmon are on their spawning runs in and around the harbors.
 - October – Salmon can still be caught from shore. Try lake trout on the south side and Indiana shorelines.
 - November – It can be a slow month, but try for muskies or crappies on the Chain. In some of the less populated areas, you would swear you are in Canada.
- December – Early ice on some of the channels on the Chain can be fun. Those tasty perch also can be caught on the Chicago shoreline and harbors.

It's that time of the year and Arlington Anglers had their booth at the Schaumburg Fishing, Travel and Outdoor Expo. We met a lot of many interested fishermen and their families whom we hope to see at our next meeting. Thanks to those of you who stopped by.

A fishing club will introduce you to a large number of new friends that share the same interests and hobbies. The club will provide outings and trips that you never would have even thought about. 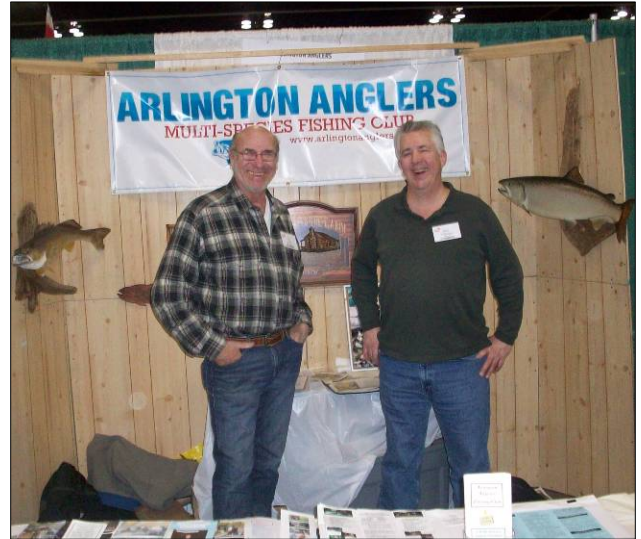

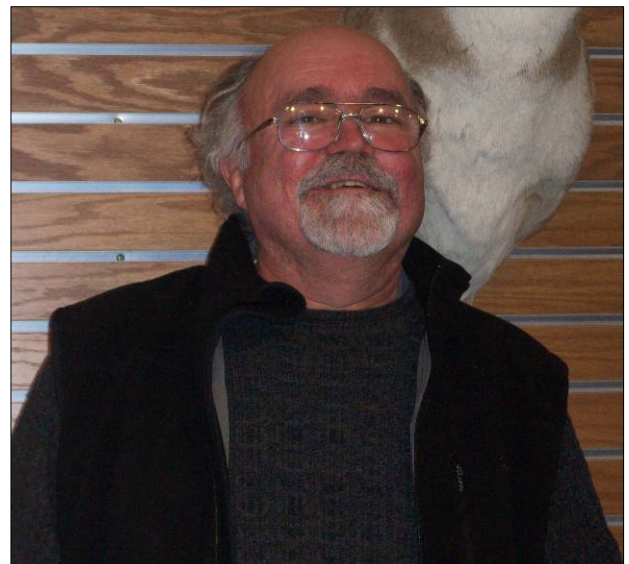
